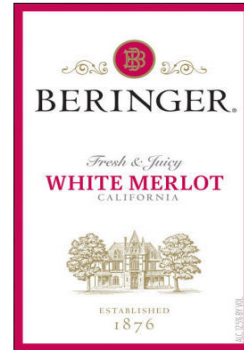

"CARE FOR OUR EARTH"

Do you notice people when they throw trash (plastic and paper items, cigarette butts, balloons, etc.) on the ground? If so, what feelings arise? Perhaps, there are times when you thoughtlessly do likewise. What happens to the litter that's discarded on the ground? Eventually, most of that trash ends up in waterways and is carried to the sea or ocean. According to Ocean Conservancy 60 to 80 per cent of marine debris comes from land-based sources. Marine debris can be carried thousands of miles by ocean currents and surface winds and be trapped to form a garbage patch like the one in the Pacific. Also, trash is perceived by marine creatures as food and ingested to their detriment. Each year more than 100,000 marine mammals die. Submerged debris destroys habitats. Debris affects water quality by adding chemicals to the water. As consumers, we need to make decisions to change our throw-away mentalities and make concerted efforts to reduce/eliminate trash thrown on what many consider is "the Earth bin." So, when you are out and about and catch yourself ready to toss some form of trash on the ground, put it in your pocket or carry it to a container.
