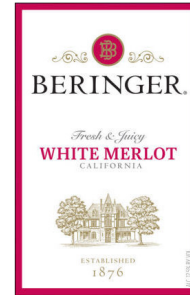

### **"CARE FOR OUR EARTH"**

The measures required to reduce/eliminate human-activated climate change in order to preserve our Earth to some may be considered drastic. Among the measures is replacing fossil fuels with alternative energy sources. For many people, this raises a concern of what will happen to our economy, which is driven by fossil fuels. The opponents of this change maintain that such an endeavor will result in the collapse of our economy. This population, because of fear, may experience a "fight or flight" impulse, but both of these paths will have negative results. The better path is accommodation. Efforts that have been made in this direction will be addressed in a later article. Pursuing the development of alternative fuel energy prepares us and ensures that we will not be caught off guard. The need for farsighted vision is crucial. Most likely, the economy will stall in the short term as the changeover occurs. However, in time, the economy should rebound as history has done before. One example of this would be the changeover from horse driven carriages to gasoline powered vehicles. Also, the recent EPA circulated standards predicted that 29,000 jobs will be created in a three-year period once these regulations are implemented.
