We served our neighbors this Saturday and our shelves are bare. Please help us restock our Food Pantry by bringing any of the following:



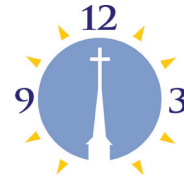

### **"CARE FOR OUR EARTH"**

People could well be wondering if global warming has been speeding up or slowing down. Roberto Mera, a Kendall Science Fellow with the Union of Concerned Scientists, maintains that over the past 15 years surface temperatures have continued to rise but not at the rate of the late 20th century. How come? He states that this is likely due to some degree of short-term cooling brought on by such phenomena as ocean circulation patterns that pull heat into the deep ocean or to volcanic eruptions. I'd like to believe that the efforts of thousand and thousands of people like yourselves who have taken steps to reduce carbon emissions also contribute to this slowing down! These phenomena, however, could change in the other direction thereby increasing the pace of warming. He notes that some aspects of climate warming like sea level rise and loss of Arctic ice have accelerated. The heat absorbed by the oceans is causing the water to expand, contributing to sea level rise. So, apparently, more people effort is needed to reduce this expansion. Keep up and, possibly, increase your good work to preserve our Earth.
