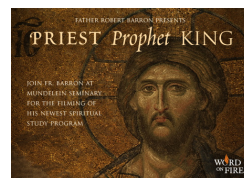
Budget 2014/2015 is \$1,115,584.00. This includes Schools Parish Sharing Assessment of \$71,674.00

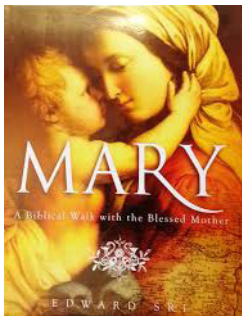

“CARE FOR OUR EARTH”

Many of us may think that the real victim of climate change and air pollution is the Earth; but it is not! Humans and other living creatures are. Our Earth will endure whatever harm and destruction that we impose. And the dire consequences of climate change will not only affect future generations; they are presently taking a toll on populations right now, most noticeably in undeveloped countries. Our concern for those populations which are being impacted now may leave us feeling helpless. However, we can take some consolation in the realization that these people are not suffering alone.
