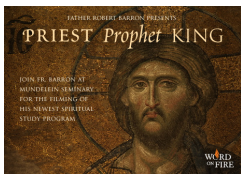

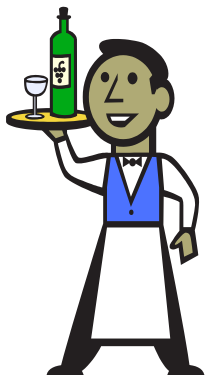

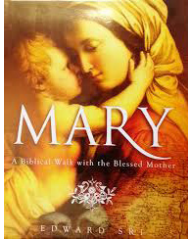

“CARE FOR OUR EARTH”

In his State of the Union Address, the President stated that America is #1 in wind power, which means that we, as energy consumers, are gaining greater access to clean, homegrown, affordable power. According to the American Wind Association, the U.S. has outstanding wind resources, providing enough energy potential that is 10 times the amount of electricity consumption for the entire country. We have the most productive wind turbines with taller towers and longer blades, which have made them more efficient. Project developers have placed the turbines in environmentally friendly and wind resource-rich locations. For awhile the U.S. had a policy incentive which rewarded electricity production. A key federal policy (PTR Production Tax Relief) offered tax relief to projects based on how much power they produced. Unfortunately, this policy has expired and was not renewed by our legislators. The Power of Wind group along with other environmental organizations is seeking to educate our legislators about wind power; to fight for energy policies in state legislatures; and to counter the prevalence of misinformation. They need and can use our support and backing.

From the 2015 Lenten Message of Pope Francis: “God’s people, then, need this interior renewal, lest we become indifferent and withdraw into ourselves. To further this renewal, I would like to propose for our reflection three biblical texts.”

“In the second place, every Christian community is called to go out of itself and to be engaged in the life of the greater society of which it is a part, especially with the poor and those who are far away. The Church is missionary by her very nature; she is not self-enclosed but sent out to every nation and people.

Her mission is to bear patient witness to the One who desires to draw all creation and every man and woman to the Father. Her mission is to bring to all a love which cannot remain silent. The Church follows Jesus Christ along the paths that lead to every man and woman, to the very ends of the earth (cf. *Acts* 1:8). In each of our neighbours, then, we must see a brother or sister for whom Christ died and rose again. What we ourselves have received, we have received for them as well. Similarly, all that our brothers and sisters possess is a gift for the Church and for all humanity.

Dear brothers and sisters, how greatly I desire that all those places where the Church is present, especially our parishes and our communities, may become islands of mercy in the midst of the sea of indifference!”
