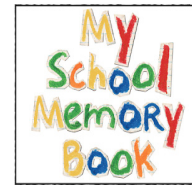
COLUMBARIUM: There are Columbarium niches available. The cost is \$2,000.00 for a double niche. Contact Terry McElroy at 481-5702.

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As Catholics, we are called to live a life of commitment. Beginning shortly after our birth, many of our parents commit us to Christ and to the Catholic faith through our baptism. Through the sacraments of reconciliation and the Eucharist, we commit ourselves to Christ over and over again by renewing our lives through the forgiveness of sins, and by receiving the living body and blood of Christ. Through confirmation, we commit our lives to the workings of the Holy Spirit and to fulfilling the mission He gives to the entire church. That mission is to go out and share Christ with the world.

The Living Our Mission campaign does just as Christ commissions us to do – share the Gospel. From providing long-term healthcare to priests throughout our diocese, to endowing our social ministry here at Holy Family, all aspects of this campaign help us to live the mission entrusted to us by Christ. As you learn more about what this campaign will do, I ask you to consider something we embrace as Catholics – commitment.

Within the next few weeks, I will ask every one of you to make a commitment to the Living Our Mission campaign. I know that for every family in this parish, a sacrificial commitment will look different and *I am deeply appreciative of each and every gift, regardless of the size*. But I want to ask a group of people in our parish to consider a special commitment to this campaign.

In order to reach our goal of \$1.5 million, I am praying that 50 families will make a pledge of \$15,000 to the Living Our Mission campaign. Your sacrificial pledge can be made over a five year period (\$3,000 per year for five years). Please take some time to pray about whether or not you might be able to make a pledge of this size. I encourage you to call the parish office to set-up an appointment with me if you are discerning this pledge and would like to have a few more questions answered.

Once again, I send my sincere gratitude to all those who have contributed so far. In June, every parishioner will have the opportunity to make a gift. If you would like to make your pledge before then, please call the parish office to set-up an appointment with me.

At the time of this bulletin's printing, a handful of parishioners have already stepped forward and made generous pledges totaling just over \$200,000. Thank you to those who have helped us so far.

May God bless you and know that you are in my daily prayers.

“CARE FOR OUR EARTH”

Solar power is one form of clean energy that produces no global warming pollution. It’s an eye-opening time for us inhabitants living on the East Coast to learn the extent to which solar power is skyrocketing. According to the Union of Concerned Scientists, in 2006 only 30,000 households had rooftop solar; by 2013, that number increased to 400,000; the projected figure for 2020 is between 900,000 and 3.8 million! Will your house be numbered among 2020 estimate? Within the past year a movement, a non-profit group who has been quite successful in Maryland, selected Virginia Beach as a location to promote solar power. It strives to interest enough household residents (usually 30) in a particular neighborhood to commit to the installation of solar power. The cost decreases measurably when there are this number of households willing to go solar. The final price drops even further when tax credits, rebates, and other supports are available. The prediction is that by 2017, half the states could have solar as cheap as local electricity rates.
