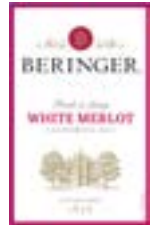

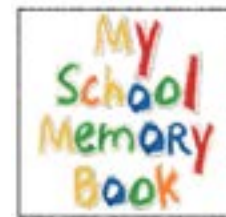

NEW EVANGELIZATION NOTES

Origins of the New Evangelization

When Cardinal Giovanni Montini assumed the Chair of Peter in 1963, he took the name Paul. He explained that he wanted to pattern his ministry after the peripatetic Apostle to the Gentiles. And so he did. He was the first pope to make apostolic journeys to six continents. He was on a mission, but it was not his alone. It belonged to the church. He reorganized the Roman Curia and changed the name of the Congregation for the Propagation of the Faith to the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples. He made evangelization a priority. When he issued his apostolic exhortation "Evangelii Nuntiandi" ("On Evangelization in the Modern World") in 1975, he lamented that Catholics were neglecting their most basic duty. "Evangelizing," he wrote, "is in fact the grace and vocation proper to the Church, her deepest identity. She exists in order to evangelize...."

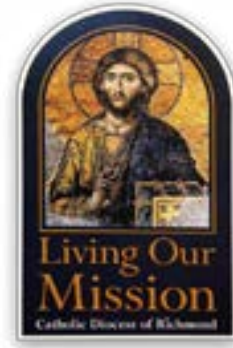
