DIOCESAN 2014 ANNUAL APPEAL UPDATE:

301 families pledged \$64,010.00 for \$143.88% of our goal of \$44,490.00. \$61,630.50 has been paid to date, leaving a balance of \$2,379.50.

With three rounds of funding, the Diocese has returned \$1.2 million to the parishes, which is the highest in the history of the Appeal. In 2013, Holy Family received \$13,155.38 and in 2014, Holy Family has received to date \$17,663.99.

"CARE FOR OUR EARTH"

In paragraph 14 of Chapter one of "Laudato Si, mi Signore" the Pope writes "Obstructionist attitudes, even on the part of believers, can range from denial or doubt of the problem to indifference or blind confidence in technical solutions." The Pope also made some strong remarks to those who are promoting this attitude of doubt and denial of climate change. Their efforts have influenced a large portion of people. Seeking to counteract these tactics to misinform people, the Union of Concerned Scientists has drawn upon evidence derived from 85 documents that were obtained by leaks, lawsuits and other means. Spanning 3 decades, these documents reveal that the world's largest fossil fuel companies were fully aware of the reality of climate change but continued to spend tens of millions of dollars to sow doubt and promote contrarian arguments they know to be wrong. The collected documents reveal a variety of deceitful tactics such as secretly funding purportedly independent scientists and even forging letters from nonprofit groups to try to influence members of Congress. Doubters and deniers of climate change having this misinformation can sound pretty convincing with their arguments. Hopefully, those of us who believe in climate change being human activated stand firm in this belief and those who doubt or deny it search into it more carefully.


