"CARE FOR OUR EARTH:"

In the first chapter of Pope Francis' Encyclical, "Laudato Si," the Pope addresses the topic of what is happening to our Common Home. What a true and meaningful reference to our Earth as being our Common Home! He goes on to write "but a sober look at our world shows that the degree of human intervention, often in the service of business interests and consumerism, is actually making our Earth less rich and beautiful, ever more limited and grey, even as technological advances and consumer goods continue to abound limitlessly. We seem to think that we can substitute an irreplaceable and irretrievable beauty with something which we have created ourselves" (para. 34). This summary quote bears much reflection to help us to realize to what extent (greater or lesser) we harbor such an attitude. We in this region are fortunate to have had the opportunity to consider how the encyclical speaks to the environmental issues facing us by attending the event at Sacred Heart Church in Norfolk on August 25. This was a good start to educating ourselves on the Pope's Encyclical.
