Haiti**



Thanks to the runners and walkers of last year's 5K Run/Walk for Haiti. The Proceeds of the Run/Walk support the Just Haiti coffee Co-op. The Holy Family Haiti committee has started selling fair-trade coffee from Just Haiti Coffee.

Next spring, 25 families from our twinning parish in Baptiste Haiti will start growing fair trade coffee on their land. The coffee will be sold to Just Haiti Coffee Co-op, shipped to Miami, Florida, and sold directly to distributors like The Church of the Holy Family. The Haiti Committee of Holy Family will pay for an agronomist to train the growers for the first year. Growers will obtain microloans to purchase plants and tools.

Just Haiti has seven partnerships and Holy Family and Baptiste will be their eighth. The Haiti Committee is excited to build this sustainable economic relationship with the people of Baptiste. Look for more information in future bulletins and look out for more free trade coffee to be sold at Holy Family Church.

"CREATION CARE CORNER:"

How important is our health as compared to the money we spend on the food we eat? By not paying attention to what contents are in our food or how it was processed, we may save a few dollars, but end up in the long or short run paying quite a bit more for the health problems we could eventually incur!

Much of our food is not regulated to much of an extent by the FDA. With many foods we probably are ingesting preservatives, dyes, GMOs, an overabundance of salt or sugar and other ingredients which are harmful to our health.

A good way to insure that our food is nutritious and safe is to look for the labels that give assurance the products are rigorously researched and monitored. Such labels would be:

- **ANIMAL WELFARE APPROVED**, that assures the animals are raised with stringent welfare standards; **USDA ORGANIC**, which prohibits the use of synthetic pesticides, hormones, antibiotics, GMOs and means that 95-99% of the ingredients by weight is organic;
- **CERTIFIED ORGANIC**, which stipulates that the products have 70-94% organic ingredients by weight;
- **FAIR TRADE CERTIFIED**, which means that the products meet the standards of local sustainability, decent working conditions, and fair prices for the workers;
- **NON-GMO PROJECT CERTIFIED**, which assures that a product contains less than 0.9% genetically modified organisms;
- **GRASS FED**, which verifies that the cattle were on a 100% forage diet, no hormones or antibiotics.

Granted, not many of the stores in our area (except organic food stores and farmers markets) carry food products with these labels, but keep them in mind as they will become more available.
