Our region is blessed for having at least two WETLAND FORESTS: the Great Dismal Swamp and First Landing State Park. Wetland Forests avail us numerous important benefits, which contribute to our health and the environment's well-being. They filter our natural system, combat pollution, remove excess nutrients, secure fresh drinking water for surrounding and downstream communities, provide protection from dangerous flooding, sequester carbon, as well as provide economical value. Wetland Forests are land areas, saturated with water, either permanently or seasonally, such that they take on the characteristics of a distinct ecosystem. They can be swamp forests, peatland forests, or intertidal forests. They are distinguished from other land forms or water bodies by their characteristic vegetation of aquatic plants and trees, which are adapted to the unique hydric soil.

According to Dogwood Alliance, Wetland Forests in our 14 southern states are among the most unique and amazing forests in the world! These forests, which span 35 million acres, are also among the most diverse on Earth, supplying critical habitat for rare wildlife. Until 15 years ago, nearly 80 southern Forest Wetlands were drained and converted to agriculture, developments, or replaced with fast growing pine trees used for lumber and paper. Since 15 years ago, the adoption of various regulations have curbed the destruction of these forests. Wetland Forest conservation and restoration need to be recognized as an urgent priority. Give yourself a gift and visit a Wetland Forest in our region. Also, speak up against any further destruction of these precious natural resources.
