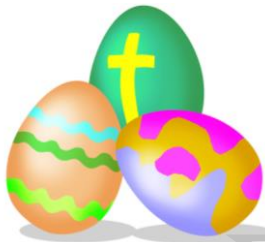

Why did Michelangelo place his Jonah depiction in the Sistine Chapel right above *The Last Judgment*?

When the Pharisees asked for a miraculous sign of Jesus' power, he responded that no sign would be given except for the sign of Jonah. Jonah was in the belly of the whale for three days, where he should have died, just as Jesus was in the tomb for three days after His death. Both were “resurrected” by God's power to fulfill a divine plan, Jonah finally obeyed God and went to Nineveh to preach repentance, and Jesus was “obedient unto death,” and so eternal life is possible for all who repent and follow Him.
