WEEKLY WISDOM



Where did the Bible Come From?

The Bible is a collection of divinely inspired books written over hundreds of years by human authors and editors. We can identify the writers of some of these texts (for example, Lk 1:1-4; 1 Cor 1:1-3). But for many others, the identity of the writers has been lost to history. Only 73 books were chosen for inclusion in the scriptural "canon." So who had the power to discern and the authority to declare which books belong in the Bible? That role was played by the "magisterium" (authoritative teaching office) of the Catholic Church, acting in light of the broader apostolic Tradition.

In general, there was broad agreement among early Christians about which books belonged in the Bible, but this agreement was not absolute. Some Church fathers regarded as unscriptural certain books that are currently in the canon of the New Testament, while others thought that certain books not now in the New Testament canon were part the inspired revelation. St. Athanasius in 367 was the first Church father to list the currently accepted twenty-seven New Testament books.

In the latter part of the fourth century (387, 392 and 393), several regional councils listed the books of the canon as we now know it. Their pronouncements were universally accepted until the Protestant Reformation challenged them more than eleven centuries later. In response, the canon was reaffirmed by the Catholic ecumenical Council of Trent in 1546. Clearly, the Church and the apostolic Tradition are equally necessary; without them, we would not even know which books belong in the Bible.

"CREATION CARE CORNER:"

It is summer, so let's for once touch on a lighthearted, but interesting environmental topic like Air-Ink. Cars release about 20% of the world's quota of carbon dioxide. We breathe in an average of 2 gallons of that polluted air every minute. A couple scientists in the MIT Media Lab in Boston came up with the creative idea of Air-Ink, which is a professional art supply made directly from car exhaust and soot. They created the Kaalink, a unit that captures soot before it is unleashed into the atmosphere. Then, they recycle the quarantined pollutants into ink, removing heavy metals and carcinogens in the process. The remaining carbon-based pigment then becomes Air-Ink, which is being embraced by artists, mostly in countries that are struggling with heavy air pollution. Air-Ink is a thicker ink, ideal for filling porous surfaces, making it best useful for murals. It is solid black in color. Since June 2016, this team has cleaned 1.6 trillion liters of air!!! This is an example of artists and the environment becoming connected. (Most of the information in this article comes from Green Life, a periodic tip issued by the Sierra Club.)
