"CARE FOR OUR EARTH"

In a time when our Earth, our life source, is being threatened with destruction of what is needed for life to be sustained, there are people who question or even deny this reality. Not so the Catholic Church, which is becoming a strong proponent for creation. The concern for life in all its forms is a primary one! If there is a certain wisdom in the pro-life assertion that other rights become meaningless if the RIGHT to life is not upheld, then it is reasonable to assert that the RIGHT to life has little meaning if our Earth Who sustains us is destroyed. Among the recent remarks spoken by Pope Francis are: "It is imperative to be custodians of creation"; and "Creation is not a property which can be used at will, or even less the property of a few: creation is a gift"; and "if we destroy creation, creation will destroy us." The Vatican held a 5-day summit in May entitled, "Sustainable Humanity, Sustainable Nature, Our Responsibility." The many experts from various disciplines addressed the pressing concerns of climate change and the Church's role in promoting sustainability. The *National Catholic Reporter* in a recent editorial stated that the Catholic Church's #1 pro-life issue is the environment and that the Church has become a major player in educating the public to scientific data and in motivating people to act for CHANGE. *The Catholic Virginian* can be an important instrument in promoting our education by publishing more articles regarding our environment. Also, we Catholics need to listen more carefully and act on the messages about our environment that come from our pulpits.
