He is now resting at home after intensive care in the hospital. It was thoughtful of everybody who came to his bedside, gave him Holy Communion, and daily prayers.

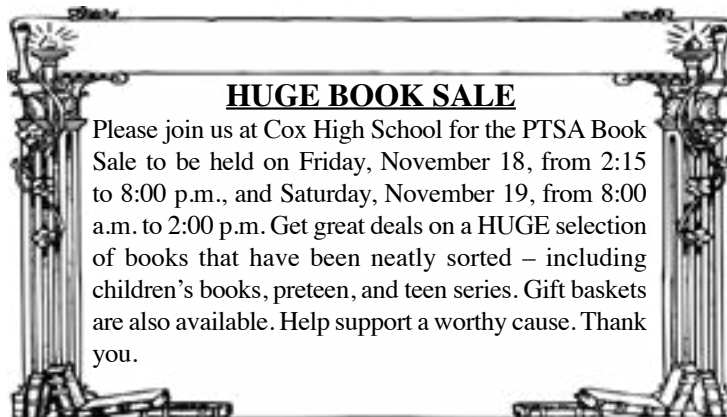

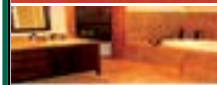
