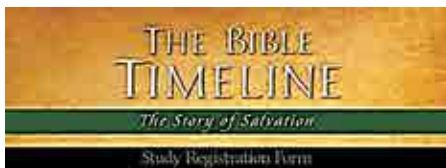

“Humility is the mother of many virtues because from it obedience, fear, reverence, patience, modesty, meekness, and peace are born. He who is humble easily obeys everyone, fears to offend anyone, is at peace with everyone, and is kind with all.”

Humility is the opposite of pride. It is gratefully walking in God’s grace, love, and forgiveness. It is recognizing that you need God’s help, knowing you can’t truly succeed by your own strength. It is the foundation of prayer and repentance. Humility is thanking God for your talents and gifts and giving Him the credit for your accomplishments. Likewise, you can be aware of your failures without being devastated by them, but instead seek God in faith and prayer. Biblical humility does not mean that you become a doormat. In fact, it is quite the opposite. Humility is being comfortable with who you are in Christ and seeking to build others up, not yourself.

In his letter to the Ephesians St. Paul wrote, “I, then, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to live in a manner of the call you have received, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love, striving to preserve the unity of the spirit through the bond of peace” (4:1-3).

"CREATION CARE CORNER:"

Where do the industries and corporations, which pollute and endanger the climate and our environment, that produce harmful products, that prey on the marginal and the poor, get their funding to carry out their projects? From banks and investment companies of which we are customers. By pulling our money from these banks and companies (divestment), we are making a statement – that we disagree with and oppose how they are choosing to allocate our money. We also reduce the resources available to them for supporting activities that result in harm and danger to our Earth. The goal of divestment is to send a market signal to companies and entire industries that their actions are not sustainable and their customers want them to change course.

According to the environmental organization, Green America, that as of June 2017, institutions representing over \$5.45 trillion in assets and more than 58,000 individuals with about \$5.2 billion in assets have made a fossil-fuel divestment commitment. Divestment is a powerful strategy that acutely raises the stakes for the continuation of practices, policies, and projects, which are almost exclusively directed to profit rather than the health and well-being of people and our Earth.
