“CREATION CARE CORNER:”

There probably have been occasions when you have come across someone, who denies that climate change is human behavior.

This denier could maintain that carbon dioxide levels have risen and fallen naturally in the past. And that is true! What needs to be taken into account, however, is that these so called natural emissions have taken place over thousands of years. Scientists have looked carefully at the natural factors known to influence planetary temperatures and found that they are not changing nearly enough. The warming is extremely rapid on the geologic time scale, and no other factor can explain it as well as attributing it to human emissions. So, the question is, how can we be certain that humans are responsible for the increase of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere at the present time? According to an article in the *New York Times* on September 24, there is hard evidence, including studies that use radioactivity, to distinguish industrial emissions from natural emissions, and they have shown that the extra gas is coming from human activity. Geologists claim that humans are now pumping the gas into the air much faster than nature has ever done, and much more than nature can tolerate.

It is important to keep up with research and its results, so that we can have a stronger ground for our position on scientific issues.
