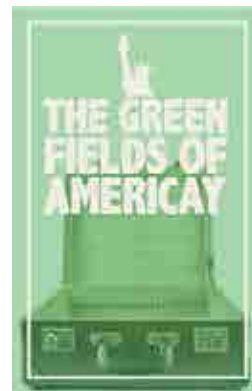

“CREATION CARE CORNER”

The United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization maintains that 95% of our food is grown in soil. One-third of the world's soils have been degraded, transforming them from living soil to degraded dirt.

LIVING SOIL contains live organisms. These organisms perform vital functions in the soil, maintaining soil structure, regulating the soil's ability to filter and hold water, decomposing organic matter, suppressing parasites and diseases, breaking down pollutants, and sequestering carbon. **DEAD DIRT** contains chemicals resulting from pesticides and fungicides and along with excessive tillage that kills beneficial microorganisms. Without these living organisms, the soil becomes less fertile and retains less water and sequesters less carbon. In **LIVING SOIL** the waste, residue, and metabolites from plants, animals, and microbes feed nutrients into the soil, which, in turn, feed the plants and organisms. **DEGRADED DIRT** relies on chemical fertilizers to provide nutrients to crops. **LIVING SOIL** absorbs and helps purify water (studies show that living soil may hold 10% more water than dirt). **SOILS DEGRADED** through excessive chemical use and compacted through excessive tillage are more susceptible to droughts and flooding. In case you will be gardening, this information highlights the need to have your soil tested by Virginia Tech Cooperative, to be careful how you use fertilizers, or to use fertilizers that do not contain harmful chemicals.
